## Nyia 尼雅遗址 China





Nyia is an archeological site bearing witness to the past splendor of a major Silk **Road** commercial center located in **Miran**. an oasis in the **Taklamakan Desert** (China). This place used to be a crossroads of cultures - so much so that such diverse remains as frescoed Buddhist stupas and the Xiahoe Tomb Complex can be found here. Here lie the mummies of 30 Europoid individuals with reddish hair and green eyes who lived more than 4,000 years ago and spoke a now extinct Indo-European language, **Tocharian**. White-skinned people are also featured in some frescoes covering the walls of the nearby Kizil Caves.
