## Some or Any?

We use some in **affirmative sentences**...

... and (not) any in **negative** ones.



Keep nurturing **some** dreams, folks... You don't need any dreams: just cling to reality.



Would you like some life tips?
Well, stay
foolish and
stay hungry.

In interrogative sentences, we use ANY when we are questioning the existence of a quantity. By contrast, we use SOME when we know that a given quantity of something exists, but we are asking whether the listener likes it, would like it, etc.

Do I have
any life tips
for you? No, I
don't. You
learn life by
living it.
