



Me, Myself & I

Choosing the correct pronoun can be difficult when there's someone else in the sentence as well. The easiest way to see if you're using the correct pronoun in these sentences is to remove the other subject/object and see what pronoun is left. **We usually put the other person before *I* or *me*. *Myself* can also be used as an intensifier: *I myself don't like grammar.***

I

We use *I* for the **subject** in a sentence:

I cooked dinner.

Jeff and I
composed a new
song.

ME

We use *me* for the **object** in a sentence:

She gave *me* the
finger.

Lucy took *Jane*
and *me* out for
dinner.

MYSELF

We use *myself* to refer back to the subject of the sentence (it is a **reflexive pronoun**).

I gave *myself* a
new laptop for
my birthday.
