Dr. Victor Frankenstein is the figment of the imagination of British writer Mary Shelley, wife to poet Percy Bysshe Shelley. Frankenstein: or, the Modern Prometheus is a Gothic novel that can also be considered as one of the earliest examples of science fiction. Mary Shelly wrote it in Geneva (Switzerland), which also provided the setting for the novel itself. The year was 1816, and Mary was seeking shelter from the scandal broken in England subsequent to her elopement with Shelley, and their ambiguous relationship with her own step-sister Claire Clairmont. In Geneva Mary, Percy and Claire joined another British social outcast, Lord Byron, who was staying at Villa Diodati with his friend William Polidori. Rumor has it that during a stormy summer they would entertain themselves with German ghost stories until they eventually decided to write one each. The two most original were Polidori's **The Vampyre** and Mary Shelley's Frankenstein.
