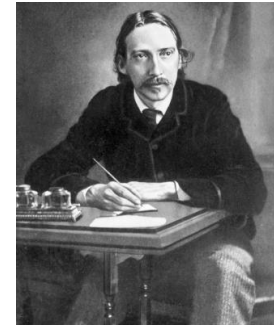

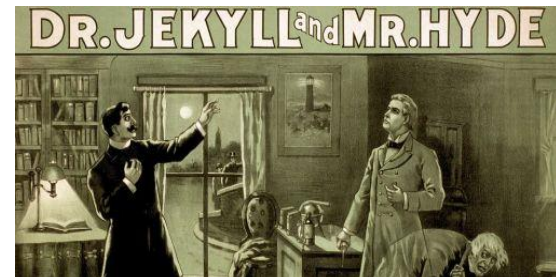


The most famous **psychomachia** of all times, along with the legend of **Dr. Faustus**: the rational and instinctual sides of the human soul struggling to overpower each other. Even though the (unhappy) ending to the story may sound predictable to the modern reader, it certainly was not in **1887**, the year when Scottish novelist **Robert Louis Stevenson** wrote his most famous novella and, at the same time, gave one of the first (semi-conscious) literary insights into the workings of the **unconscious** in literature. Ten years later, **Sigmund Freud** would first theorize the struggle between **ego** (rationality) and **id** (unconscious drives) in some letters to his friend Wilhelm Fliess.
