The Greek god Pan is reported to have invented the musical instrument known as syrinx (or pan pipes), which he named after a **nymph** he pursued in the woods. In an attempt to rescue herself from his harassment, she sought help from some river nymphs who turned her into water reeds. As soon as he saw this transformation. Pan cut the reeds and turned them into a musical instrument he could kiss and hold near all the time. This mythological anecdote nicely blends Pan's two chief interests: women (he is so **lusty** as to be often portrayed with his penis erected) and music. A yet further famous episode involving Pan is his **musical competition** against Apollo, who invented the lyre. King Midas was entrusted with picking the winner: as soon as he chose Pan, Apollo touched his ears and turned them into a donkey's...
