Nonplus is a state of puzzlement or perplexity:

Jane was puzzled, and scratched her head like a woman at a nonplus.

To be nonplussed means to be at a loss as to what to say, think, or do.

I was nonplussed by his remarks about my lifestyle.

Does nonplus puzzle you? Etymology may help clarify things. In Latin, 'non plus' means 'no more'. In the earliest known uses, which date to the 16th century, it was used as a noun synonymous with quandary, which means dilemma). Someone brought to a nonplus had reached an impasse in an argument and could say no more. Within a few decades of the first known use of the noun, people began using nonplus as a verb, and today it is often used in participial form with the meaning perplexed.
