Bilby

The Bilby is a nocturnal omnivorous **marsupial** inhabiting arid areas of central Australia. Its distinctive features are a long bandicoot muzzle and huge ears. It is the same size as a rabbit. It is a skilled burrower, and uses its strong forepaws and claws to build tunnel systems that double as shelters from both the heat and predators. Females' **pouch** faces backwards – a feature enabling them to dig their tunnels without getting it filled with dirt. The bilby is an endangered species, as feral cats and foxes (introduced by European settlers in the 19th century) have been posing a major threat to the survival of this animal.
