## Quote #30 Christopher Hitchens

"Owners of dogs will have noticed that, if you provide them with food and water and shelter and affection, they will think you are God. Whereas owners of cats are compelled to realize that, if you provide them with food and water and affection, they draw the conclusion that **they are God**."



Christopher Eric Hitchens (1949-2011) was an **Anglo-American author** and journalist, who, in his lifetime, published more than 30 books, including five collections of essays on politics, literature and religion. His **confrontational style** of debate made him both a lauded intellectual and a controversial public figure. Having long described himself as a social democrat, a Marxist, and an anti-totalitarian, he began to break with the established political left after what he called the "tepid reaction" of the Western left to the Satanic Verses controversy, which saw a fatwa issued by Ayatollah Khomeini to order Muslims to kill writer Salman Rushdie in 1989 after the publication of his (purportedly) blasphemous book The Satanic Verses. His writings include critiques of public figures such as Bill Clinton, Henry Kissinger, Mother Teresa and Diana; he also advocated for the separation of church and state. As an antitheist, he regarded the concept of a god or supreme being as a totalitarian belief that impedes individual freedom. He argued that free expression and scientific discovery should replace religion as a means of informing ethics and defining codes of conduct for human civilization. The dictum 'What can be asserted without evidence can be dismissed without evidence' has become known as 'Hitchens's razor' (with reference to Occam's razor).
