## Character #26 Big Brother

Big Brother is a fictional character and symbol of totalitarian rule in Nineteen Eighty-Four by George Orwell (1949). He is ostensibly the leader (however, most likely a symbolic figurehead) of Oceania, a dictatorship where the ruling Party wields total power over the inhabitants, who are under constant surveillance by the authorities, mainly by telescreens. People are constantly reminded of their subjection by the slogan "Big Brother is watching you". Yet, they willingly accept it as part of being brainwashed into believing that individuality and free thinking are detrimental to the social order, thus creating a need for an authoritarian leader to enforce gregariousness. This explains why in modern culture the term 'Big Brother' is suffused with negative overtones connected with the abuse of government power, particularly with respect to civil rights, and often specifically related to mass surveillance.
