Musa J Of Mali

Musa Keita I (ca. 1280-1337) was the tenth Mansa (king) of the wealthy **West African Mali Empire**. He was a devout Muslim, and his **pilgrimage to Mecca** in 1324-1325 made him famous all over northern Africa and the Middle East in that he was followed by **60,000 men** (12,000 of whom were slaves), **each** carrying 4 pounds of gold bars and 80 camels, each carrying between 50 and 300 pounds of gold dust. On his way to Mecca, Musa lavished gold on the poor he met along his route. A variety of historical sources report Musa's generosity as well as the way in which this generosity inadvertently destroyed the **economy** of the regions through which he passed. In the cities of Cairo, Medina, and Mecca, the sudden influx of gold devalued the metal for an entire **decade.** To rectify the gold market, Musa borrowed all the gold he could carry from money-lenders in Cairo, at high interest. This is the only time recorded in history that one man directly controlled the price of gold in the Mediterranean.
