Bark up the Wrong Tree



means picking the wrong person when it comes to scolding or putting the blame onto someone. This idiom comes from the figurative use of the verb to bark (which literally means the sound made by dogs) to refer to speaking harshly to someone, as in 'Don't bark at me for such a tiny mistake!'
