

Old Possum's Book of Practical Cats
by T.S. Eliot

Few people probably know that **T.S. Eliot**, author to such solemn and committed works as **The Waste Land** (1922) and **Murder in the Cathedral** (1935) also wrote in the 1930s a playful **poem collection for children**, *Old Possum's Book of Practical Cats*. Even fewer people probably know that this poem collection actually provided the basis for one of the best known musicals ever, **Cats**.

Before collecting and publishing them in 1939, T.S. Eliot had written the poems to be enclosed in letters for his godchildren. In those letters, he would refer to himself as 'Old Possum' – hence the title of the book. T.S. Eliot himself illustrated the first edition, even though later the poems would be illustrated also by Nicolas Bentley (1940), Edward Gorey (1982) and Axel Scheffler (2009).

Eliot's verse was set to music in the 1970s by **Andrew Lloyd Webber** and, since the poet's widow, Valerie, immediately fell in love with Webber's work, she gave the blessing for the adaptation of the poems into a musical. This musical, entitled **Cats**, premiered at the **New London Theatre** in May **1981** before getting staged in **Broadway**. As of 2017, Cats is the fourth longest-running musical in Broadway history.
