



BROWNIES

A brownie is a **baked dessert** developed in the **United States** at the end of the **19th century** and popularized in Northern America during the first half of the 20th century. Depending on its density, it may be either **fudgy** or **cakey** and it often includes **chocolate chips** or **pecan nuts**. A variation made with brown sugar and chocolate bits but without melted chocolate in the batter is called a **blonde brownie** or **blondie**. Brownies are typically accompanied by milk or coffee. They are sometimes served warm with ice cream – in that case, they are known as '**à la mode**'. Other delightful ways to enjoy a brownie is by topping it with **whipped cream** or sprinkling it with **powdered sugar**.
