

by George Orwell

Nineteen Eighty-Four was published in 1949 by English author George Orwell. The novel is set in Airstrip One (a futuristic version of Great Britain), a province of the superstate Oceania in a world of perpetual war, ubiquitous government surveillance, and public manipulation. For this reason, the book is often labelled as a dystopian novel, even though its author may have regarded it as realistic. The superstate and its residents are ruled by a political regime called **English Socialism**, shortened to 'Ingsoc' in Newspeak, the government's invented language meant to control people's minds through manipulative communication strategies dispossessing people of the ability to think. With respect to the media's power and their ability to control society, the novel presents a number of commonalities with the film Citizen Kane, released by Orson Wells in 1941. This control is exerted in the novel by the privileged elite of the **Inner Party**, which persecutes individualism and independent thinking as thoughtcrime, enforced by the so-called 'Thought Police'. Law abidance is ensured by **Big Brother**, the Party leader who enjoys an intense cult of personality, but who may not even exist. In other words: a system that may ring a bell to any keen observer of contemporary Western society...
