### Last, Latter and Latest

#### LAST

'Last' is the opposite of 'first':

*I got late to the concert and I was the last person in line.*

*I finished the test at the last minute.*

*Last day I went to the lake for a swim.*



#### LATTER

'The latter' follows 'the former' in a list comprising of only **two items**:

*Between the two choices, I prefer the latter.*

*The latter half of the season was warmer.*



“Do not confuse latter with ladder.”

#### LATEST

'The latest' means 'the most recent':

*Have you heard the latest news?*

*The latest movie by Tarantino has been filmed in Colorado.*
