## St. George England

According to a legend, Saint George was a **soldier** in the **Roman army** who would later convert to Christianity and become a martyr for his faith.

Saint George is one of the most venerated saints in Christianity (Latin and Eastern), including Anglican, East Syrian, and Miaphysite churches. He is one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers and is regarded as one of the most prominent military saints, immortalized in the myth of Saint George killing the **Dragon** in Beirut, Lebanon. His memorial, Saint George's Day, is traditionally celebrated on the Julian date of **April 23**<sup>rd</sup> (currently May 6<sup>th</sup> according to the Gregorian Calendar). Countries that celebrate St George's Day include Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Cyprus, England, Georgia, Greece, Macedonia, Romania, and Serbia. Some of the cities that celebrate this saint are **Genoa** in Italy, **Beirut** in Lebanon, **Qormi** and Victoria in Malta, Moscow in Russia, Ljubljana in Slovenia and **Rio de Janeiro** in Brazil. It is also celebrated in the **old Crown of Aragon** in Spain, that is, Aragon, Catalonia, Valencia and Majorca.
