

Albert Einstein

"The release of **atomic power** has changed everything except our way of thinking ... the solution to this problem lies in the heart of mankind. If only I had known, I should have become a watchmaker"



Although Einstein did not participate in the **Manhattan Project** itself because the American government had judged him a poor security risk for top-secret research, his letter to President Roosevelt proved the turning point in the weaponization of e=mc2. Thus Albert Einstein, a lifelong pacifist, ended up contributing to the implementation of the atomic bomb project. Einstein himself recognized the bitter irony of this situation – so much so that, shortly before dying, he admitted to an old friend, "I made one great mistake in my life – when I signed the letter to President Roosevelt recommending that atom bombs be made; but there was some justification – the danger that the Germans would make them". Accordingly, he has been quoted numerous times with some version of "Had I known that the Germans would not succeed in developing an atomic bomb, I would have done nothing".
