

CAUSATIVE VERBS Notes

- MAKING someone do something means forcing this person to do so.
- LETTING someone do something means giving this person permission to do so.
- GETTING someone TO do something means convincing this person to do so.
- HAVING someone do something (or having something done by someone) means entrusting a person with a favor, task or professional service.
