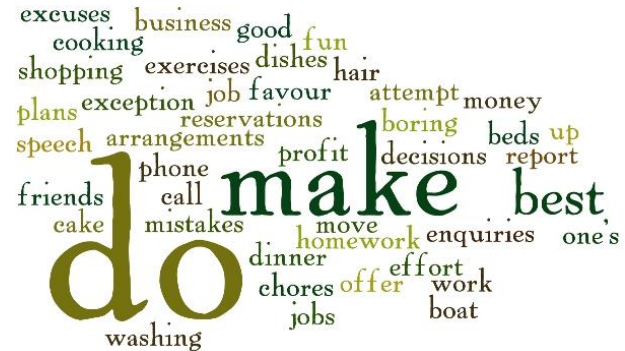


MAKE vs DO Notes

● **MAKE** designates an action seen as a result, regardless of the time spent (or not spent) on it.

— **DO** designates an action seen in terms of time spent on performing it and which may or may not lead to the wished-for result.
