What Is Superstition ?

to explain it.

If you feel like debonairly smiling at superstitions as if they were harmless popular quirks, then you may also want to pay a thought to the **2,000 victims** caused by **witch-hunters** in **Canton Vaud** alone (Switzerland) between the 15th and the 17th century. Consider also that superstition is not a vague threat lurking from a dark past: every time someone kneels down to fulfill the will of an imaginary being, the **irrationality** of superstition still poses a threat to social and moral integrity...
